Our Origin



On February 5, 2010, Greg Griffith was diagnosed with stage four Pancreatic Cancer. On Easter Weekend 2010, Amanda and Luke Ottaway presented the idea to Greg and Cathy of having a fundraiser for Pancreatic Cancer research.



That first year, \$30,000 was raised through the efforts of many in the local community. The success of those efforts soon led to the creation of **The Greg and Cathy Griffith Family Foundation**, which is the parent organization of Sideline Cancer™.

About Pancreatic Cancer

- Pancreatic Cancer is the 3rd leading cause of cancer-related deaths in the United States (behind Lung/Bronchus Cancer and Colorectal Cancer).¹
- For all stages of Pancreatic Cancer combined, the one-year relative survival rate is 20%, and the five-year rate is 7%.²
- Pancreatic Cancer is the only one of the top 10 cancer killers in the U.S. that still has a 5-year survival rate in the single digits.³
- Pancreatic Cancer research funding constitutes roughly 5% of the National Cancer Institute's Federal research funding, a figure far too low given the severity of the disease, its mortality rate, and how little is known about how to arrest the disease.⁴
