It all started with Greg Griffith of Hollidaysburg, Pennsylvania. To say Greg was an avid basketball fan is an understatement. He played, coached, and passed his love of the game to his two sons, Jordan and Jamie. One Sunday in February 2010, Greg scored 42 points in a basketball game. That following Thursday, he was diagnosed with Stage IV Pancreatic Cancer and told he had 6 weeks to live, but courageously lived 19 months.

Greg, his wife Cathy, and sons had an I CAN fighting spirit with their friends and family from the moment Greg was diagnosed. All of this support led to the creation of the Griffith Family Foundation/Sideline Cancer. Sideline Cancer is the only youth organization in the world that engages students and communities to use their philanthropic and entrepreneurial ideas to raise awareness and funds for pancreatic cancer research. It's only fitting that one of the biggest platforms Sideline Cancer has taken on to promote awareness of pancreatic cancer is with basketball in the TBT on ESPN.

Pancreatic cancer is one of the world's deadliest cancers with a 5 year survival rate of 9%. It is also projected to become the #2 cancer killer by the year 2022. We spread awareness with the World Pancreatic Cancer Coalition for Alex Trebek, Greg Griffith, and families of the 56,770 people who are projected to be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer this year.
