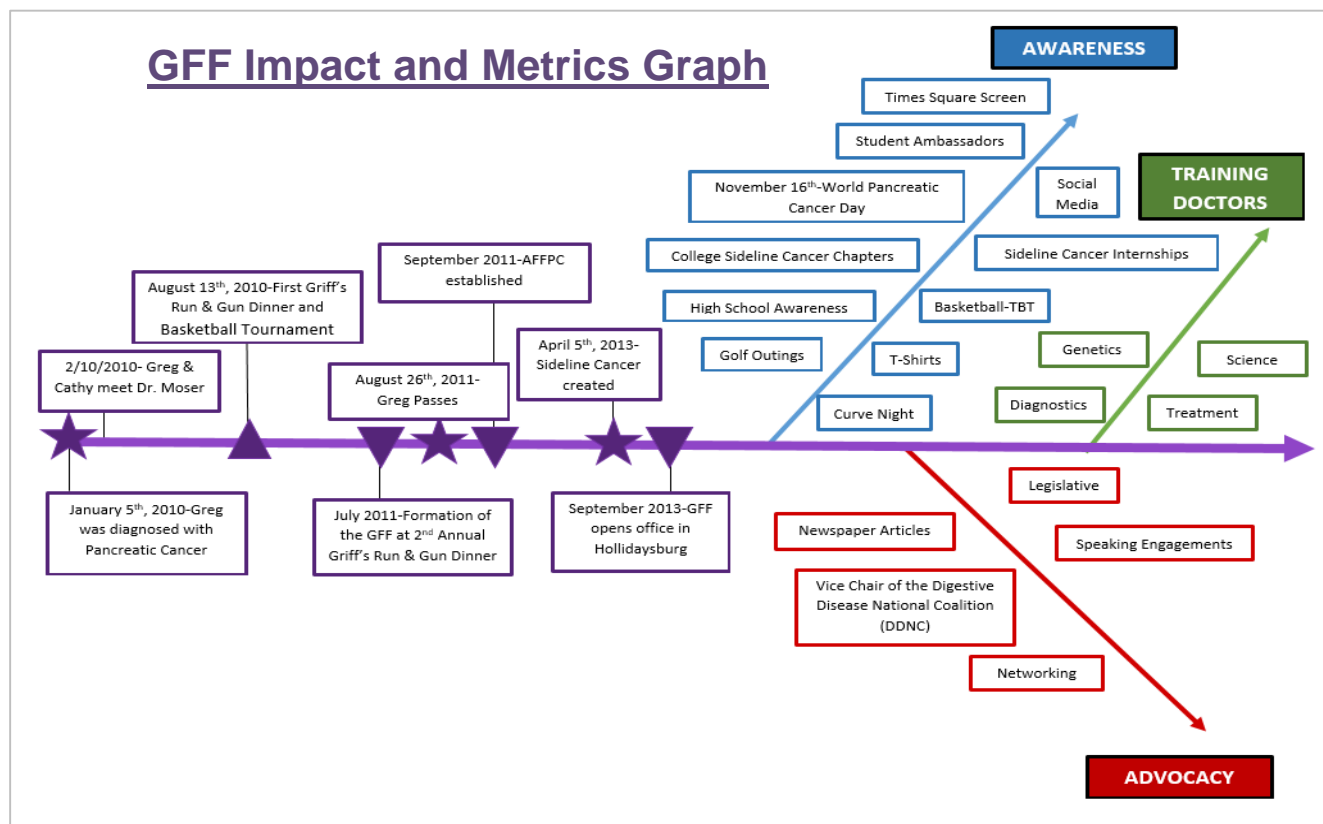

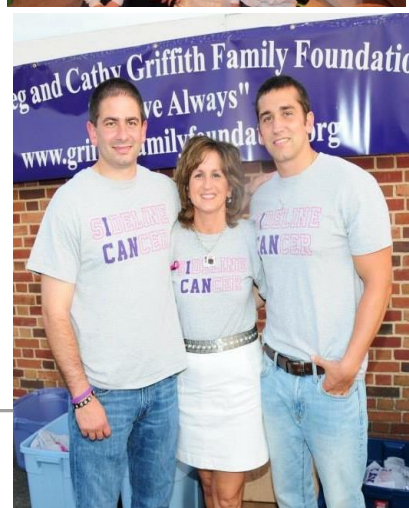

Our mission and vision aligns with **connecting patients, families and communities by taking pancreatic cancer off the sideline and to the finish line** for a cure. The most shining example of this is, Kay Kays, Rick Jones, Christina Parish and Garry Grethel.

Kay Kays, a 25-year pancreatic cancer survivor is the guiding force behind all that the GFF has done and strives to do. She is one of the world's longest living pancreatic cancer patients. She started to fight against the disease in 1994, and after countless surgeries, and with a lot of hope, she is not only a survivor but an advocate as well. One day after Greg's diagnosis on February 5th, 2010, the Griffith Family and Greg were fortunate enough to receive a call from Kay that had inspired and helped him in ways that cannot be described. He was given two weeks to live, yet with the help of Kay he lived for another 2 years. Without her, his treatment would not have gone as well as it did. After working with Kay she inspired Cathy to become a National Pancreatic advocate herself.

Rick Jones, an accountant and loving husband and father living in central PA went to the doctor for a normal checkup, only to find out that he was diagnosed with Pancreatic Cancer. He had Stage IV Neuroendocrine Pancreatic Cancer. Because Rick had heard of the advocacy and awareness efforts of the GFF through a friend, his life was **SAVED** by The Griffith Family Foundation and their connections. Through these connections with the GFF, Rick gave Cathy Griffith, the President of the GFF a call. From there Cathy got Rick in touch with Dr. James A Moser, the Executive Director of BIDMC's new Institute for Hepatobiliary and Pancreatic Surgery. Dr. James Moser did what no doctor said they could, and was able to perform a surgery that saved his life, and gave him HOPE for a prosperous future.

Christina Parish, was another inspiration of the GFF. Cathy acted as a reference and was able to help her receive social security disability. She lived 12 years after her diagnosis of Pancreatic Cancer.

Cathy Griffith and friend Alex Hazard were able to collaborate and help an employee of Cazenovia College, **Garry Grethel** retain his salary and provide tuition waivers for his two daughters that attended the school. Cathy spoke to the President of the college to advocate for Garry and his Pancreatic Cancer diagnosis. Garry retained his salary and the two daughter's tuition were paid in full.

The most important thing to stress here **is connecting patients, families and communities, to Sideline Pancreatic Cancer.**

HOLLIDAYSBURG — Sierra Lombardi, a student volunteer for the Griffith Family Foundation and a senior at Hollidaysburg Senior High School, was nominated as a delegate to the Congress of Future Medical Leaders in Lowell, Mass., June 23 to 25.

The Congress is an honors-only program for high school students who want to become physicians or go into medical research fields.

The purpose of this event is to honor, inspire, motivate and direct the top students in the country who aspire to be physicians or medical scientists, to stay true to their dream and after the event, to provide a path, plan and resources to help them reach their goal.

Sierra's nomination letter was signed by Dr. Mario Capecchi, winner of the Nobel Prize in Medicine and the science director of the National Academy of Future Physicians and

During the three-day

Congress, Sierra joined students from across the country to hear Nobel Laureates and National Medal of Science winners talk about leading medical research. She also was given advice from Jack Andraka, Ivy League and top medical school deans on what to expect in medical school; witnessed stories told by patients who are living medical miracles; was inspired by fellow teen medical science prodigies; and learned about cutting-edge advances and the future in medicine and medical technology.

Sierra will attend the Digestive Disease National Coalition in Washington, D.C., March 7-8. She will sit on the DDNC Executive Board meetings representing the Griffith Family Foundation.

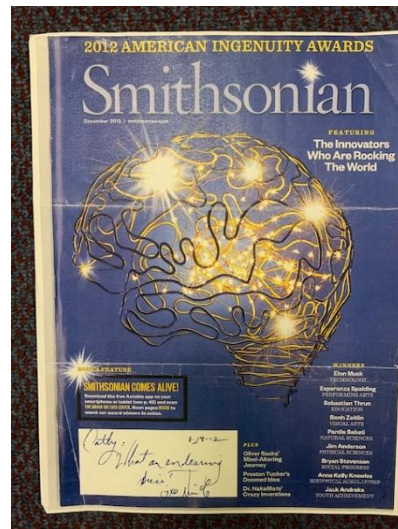
Sierra has attended the DDNC for the past three years with hopes to inspire other youth colleagues. The 2012 Intel Science

and Engineer Fair Winner Jack Andraka is a senior at Stanford University and the Griffith Family Foundation Sideline Cancer ambassador.

Andraka was recently named National Geographic Emerging Explorer and is helping detect cancer, fighting water pollution, identifying neglected tropical diseases and redefining global health approaches.

Andraka is an inspiration to all students that attend this Medical Conference that allows medical leaders, scientists and professors collaborate with the youth of today. He speaks every year at this youth event.

The National Academy of Future Physicians and Medical Scientists was founded on the belief that we must identify prospective medical talent at the earliest possible age and help these students accrue the necessary experience and skills to their ultimate goals.

Nick Novak

Former Mountain Cat Great Led Portugal League in Assists

Nick Novak, class of 2015, has gone far with his professional basketball career. Literally. Novak completed his second season of play for basketball club, Portugal's leading club for Overseas in the Liga Portuguesa in Basketball.

As the pit johnstown graduate the league in assists per game, was second in the league in scoring, and made the All Star team.

"This summer, Novak is back in the United States and will play in the Liga Portuguesa tournament (LPT). Established in 2014, LPT is an annual free-on-line, single-elimination tournament that brings together teams of NBA, former college and top international players for the chance to earn a winner take all \$2 million prize that is split among the players."

This year's tournament began in July and features 64 teams.

Novak is part of the Sideline Cancer team, which is part of the Griffiths Family Foundation's (GFF) Sideline Cancer team. Founded by Novak's team who the tournament, will donate \$700,000 to the Hutchinson House GFF, which strives to cure pancreatic cancer through research and advocacy.

The 6-foot guard plays his tempo of play as he is a caregiver for family members in his family which he set record in assists for assists, field goals made, and field goal and free-throw percentage, and scored the second most points in Mountain Cat history.

"Nick Novak is the best scoring guard that I have had in my 28 years at Pitt johnstown," said coach **Bob Robinson** (<https://johnstownathletics.com/coaches.aspx?coachid=272&pageid=406>). "He could get his shot whenever he wanted and finished the game better than any guard that I have had. He will also shoot down the field for his career which is another sign of a great All of which he will set the career assists record."

Novak comes from a great family and is a quality player that you will never regret."

According to Novak, the feelings are mutual. "Playing at Pitt johnstown was the best four years of my life, mostly thanks to coach Rick and my entire team of men and the type of people he recruits," said Novak.

As for Pitt johnstown in general, he remembers it as, "a great campus. Last year, I grew one inch. It was like a family. People take pride in the school but, I wouldn't have wanted to go anywhere else."


"All of my professors in business looked out for the students and the student-athletes. It was cool to see the professors at your games to be like 'I said, I was like a family.'"

Novak played in Portugal, he played for the new **teele City yellow jackets** team in the American Basketball Association in 2016 & 2017. The first 2017-2018 season played for Germany basketball club **Ulm** (basketball club in Berlin, and averaged a team-high 15.8 points per game).

Throughout his travels, the game he knows well has enabled him to add to new learning experiences.

You can't shake a stick without finding a summer basketball league featuring current or former Hawkeyes in action. Close to home, there's **the good of Prime Time League** featuring almost all of next year's key Hawkeyes. The NBA Summer League is set to feature recent former Hawkeyes in Peter Jaki and Jarrod Uthoff. **The Big3** includes two much older former Hawkeyes in Ricky Davis and Reggie Evans. And then there's The Basketball Tournament, aka TBT. TBT is back for its fourth year and two Fran Era Hawkeyes, Anthony Clemmons and Jarryd Cole, are suiting up in it again. TBT features 64 teams from around the country competing in a 5-on-5 single elimination basketball tournament for a \$2 million prize. The details of how the TBT organizers winnow things down to 64 teams is **available here**.

An honor to play 'for something bigger'

I will never forget the phone call I made to John Hoover the first week of March in 2014. I told him I was going to be on him the first spot on the Sideline Cancer basketball team. When he picked up the phone, I told him that I wanted him to play in honor of the Griffith Family Foundation of Hoffeldsburg in the summer basketball tournament.

Known simply as "TBT," the tournament would pay the winners from \$50,000. My general manager pitch was simple: He was a professional basketball player from central Pennsylvania, and we both knew the Griffith Family personally.

I shared with him my vision to win games in the tournament and play for something bigger, and I also made sure he knew that without our team this was not going to happen. He instantly said, "I'm in."

The TBT quickly grew, and five years later, it features 51 teams each season in a single-elimination tournament, believed on ESPN's family of networks to be offering its champion a \$2 million prize.

The tournament features college alumni teams and other teams of professional players who

Griffith foundation a tribute to determination

When Greg Griffith was diagnosed in 2011 with the disease that would take his life two years later, his wife Cathy and a group of friends joined Greg in deciding that pancreatic cancer had made life miserable for individuals and families long enough.

In July of 2011, with Greg's vision and relentless determination, The Greg and Cathy Griffith Family Foundation was born.

"The primary mission of the Foundation is to find a cure for pancreatic cancer, offer hope for those in need, connect patients, families and communities, and raise awareness of the necessity for a new direction of innovation research and treatment plans," Cathy explained. "That's a heavy lift, I realize. But anything less will fall short of dealing effectively with this dreaded disease."

According to the National Cancer Institute, pancreatic cancer is the fourth deadliest cancer. By 2020, it is expected to jump to second. Yet funding to address this particular cancer is woefully inadequate. If more efforts like the Griffith Family Foundation were undertaken, that trend would likely be reversed.

"Our volunteers and community supporters have done a tremendous job in staying committed to this cause," Cathy pointed out. "We're maintaining the signature events that were the basis of our initial effort and adding programs and projects that make the most sense. Many of those are partnerships with others who recognize the progress that we've been able to make and who want to help out."

High schools and universities are among those partners. For instance, students at Hollidaysburg Area High School started a "Sideline Pancreatic Cancer" initiative. Penn State Altoona sponsors student and medical community symposiums that heighten the awareness of pancreatic cancer.

"It is incredible what a small community like ours has been able to accomplish," Cathy acknowledged. "It is through collaborative efforts, using every one of God's gifts and talents, supported by donations and grants, that we will be able to sideline pancreatic cancer. It's possible and we have new evidence of that every day."

Sideline Cancer is a Hollidaysburg-born, student-led initiative that has raised and donated more than \$200,000 to pancreatic cancer research.

During the "Raising Awareness Case Studies from around the Globe" session, Griffith was invited to speak about the Griffith Family Foundation and Sideline Cancer Student Initiative.

Sideline Cancer's momentum ties directly into the coalition's goal, which is to drive transformational change for those affected by pancreatic cancer.

"Sideline Cancer began in 2012 by a group of high school students in Hollidaysburg, PA wanting the color purple to be the new pink to help create awareness and make pancreatic cancer a treatable disease

like breast cancer," Griffith said.

"Our goal is to continue reaching out to students to empower them with information, organization and resources, because we believe we can make a much larger impact by giving them the freedom to support this cause with their own creativity and energy."

Around the world, pancreatic cancer is the seventh most common cause of cancer-related death in men and women combined. According to the American Cancer Society, only 2 to 10 percent of those diagnosed globally survive five years.

In 2013, pancreatic cancer patient advocacy organizations from around the world, with founding sponsor Celgene Corp., began discussions about how best to support each other's efforts while raising global awareness for the deadly disease.

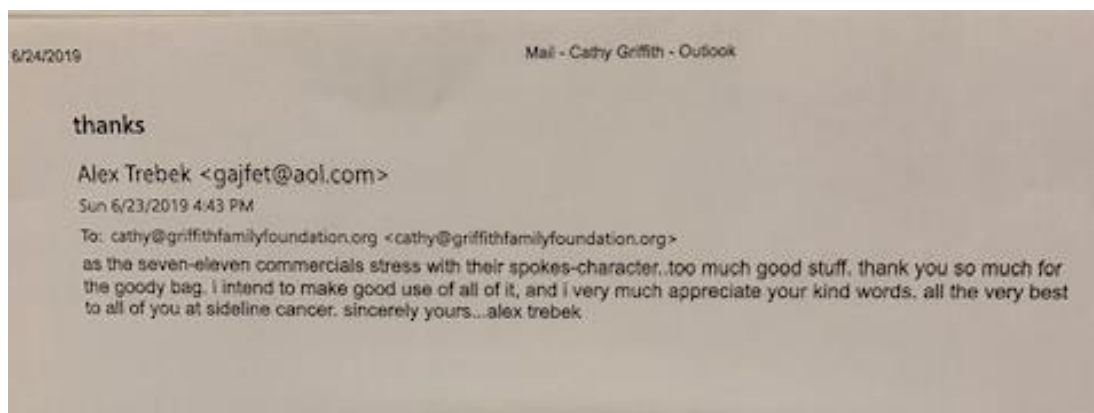
